Re: Hunter Gas Project Proposal for Exploration Holes at Broke and Bulga

I refer to my letter of 26 August 2009 and write to further inform you about our proposal to drill a total of eight (8) exploration holes at Broke and Bulga in Petroleum Exploration Licence 267 (PEL 267).

A Review of Environmental Factors (REF) has been prepared and submitted to the Department of Industry & Investment, Mineral Resources Division (formerly the Department of Primary Industries – Minerals) seeking approval.

I have enclosed a copy of the REF for your information and your comments are welcome.

The proposal is for four (4) vertical exploration core and stratigraphic holes proposed on each of AGL's properties at "Spring Mountain" 1 Oakley Lane, Broke and at "Windermere" 1946 Putty Road, Bulga in the Singleton Local Government Area. These holes are designed to give AGL more information to help evaluate the potential of the coal seam natural gas resource.

Copies of the REF have also been sent to neighbours, Singleton Council, the Bulga Community Consultation Committee (BCCC) and government agencies on the exploration program.
