# Hunter Gas Project Exploration Proposal



AGL is seeking approval to drill a total of 8 exploration holes from the Department of Industry & Investment, Mineral Resources.

An environmental assessment or Review of Environmental Factors (REF) has been prepared for the proposed exploration.

The plan is for 4 holes to be located at the Spring Mountain vineyard, off Oakley Lane at Broke and 4 holes at Windermere on Putty Road at Bulga.

The proposal is aimed at evaluating the potential coal seam gas resource in these areas.

The Bulga Community Consultation Committee (BCCC) has been briefed on the proposal. All representatives have copy of the REF.
