

## What do communities across NSW think about coal seam gas?

Finding out what communities think about natural coal seam gas is important to us. Like many companies, AGL undertakes community research to help us understand what people think of our activities. The results inform our operational decision making, ensure we're aware of community concerns and help us plan our community investment and education programs.

In August 2013, AGL commissioned Jetty Research to conduct telephone polling of 1,000 NSW households on a range of coal seam gas-related issues. This follows similar research of 1,100 households conducted by Jetty Research in mid-2012.

#### How was the research conducted?

The research involved three separate telephone surveys:

- 1 A random survey of 400 households in regions where there is no coal seam gas exploration or development.
- 2 A random survey of 200 households in the Gloucester and Manning Valleys.
- 3 A random survey of 400 households in the Hunter and Macarthur regions.

Some questions were common to all three surveys, some were asked only in certain areas, and the remainder were region-specific. Respondents were not initially informed the survey was about coal seam gas, and AGL's involvement was not highlighted until late in each survey to ensure objective responses.


Polling was conducted in August and September 2013. Results have been weighted to match the age and gender profiles of each survey region (based on ABS 2011 Census data). To find out more about how this research was conducted please go to www.agl.com.au/upstreamgas

The combined survey results present a snapshot of the NSW community's opinion on coal seam gas development.

## What benefits do you see in having AGL work in your region?

People in communities where AGL operates identified benefits of having us work in their area. These included employment opportunities (57%), bringing money into the region (37%) and cheaper/cleaner energy (36%).


#### The issues most important to you.

41 percent of NSW residents reported cost of living pressures as being the most important issue of concern to them and their family, closely followed by health (40 percent) and education (21 percent). Only 3 percent of respondents identified coal seam gas as a major concern.

## Almost half of the community is watching the coal seam gas debate closely, and less than half oppose coal seam gas production.

48 percent of respondents said they were following the natural coal seam gas debate closely – up from 28 percent in 2012. Despite this, opposition and support for natural coal seam gas exploration in NSW was virtually unchanged from our 2012 survey results.



### You want more information about coal seam gas.

61 percent of respondents feel they don't have enough information about natural coal seam gas. Three-quarters said they would be most likely to seek such information online, and you identified trusted information sources including independent organisations, the three tiers of government, scientists, researchers and the CSIRO.


## Do you feel you have enough information on CSG?



# Almost half the people in our project areas (Gloucester, Hunter, Camden) acknowledge the associated benefits of having AGL working in their community.
